## PERFORMING ARTS

In Visual Arts, the students ended the year by using the Art Elements such as colour, line, shape and pattern. Year 1 students made a 3D cat head attached to a pattern body. By using abstract technique Room 6 collage a witch's head. Room 10 painted flowers in a vase using acrylic paint and by swirling a cotton bud in blobs of red and white paint they made roses.



## KINDY

What a busy and exciting end to the term we have had in Kindy!

We explored familiar stories through retelling, reenacting and lots of imaginative play. The Three Billy Goats Gruff was a clear favourite. The children loved learning the story and even acted it out on the playground with trolls hiding under bridges. We also went on a bear hunt, stomping through the grass, the mud, and the river, and enjoyed retelling the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Our learning linked beautifully to maths as we spent time measuring and comparing objects. Students practised describing sizes, heights and lengths through hands-on experiences and classroom activities. In literacy, we explored rich language to describe what we saw and felt. Words like thick oozy mud and cold splashing water helped bring our stories to life. Students also continued developing their early reading skills by sounding out words using the sounds they know. For example, they practised breaking down the sounds in /d/o/g/ and blending them.

A highlight of the term was our Kindy Graduation. The children were amazing on stage, performing with confidence and joy. They had been practising so hard in the lead up, learning their songs, movements and speaking parts. It was wonderful to see their excitement and pride on the day. We are so proud of how far they have grown this year.



## ROOM A








## Room 1

Over the past few weeks, our Year 1 students have engaged in a range of purposeful learning experiences. In Phonics, they explored different spelling patterns for the /or/ sound, including al, augh, oor, our, oar, and ore, strengthening their phonemic awareness and spelling skills. In Writing, they studied "The Elves and the Shoemaker" and used it to innovate their own narratives, applying questioning techniques (who, what, when, where, why, how) and using subjects, adjectives, and verbs to enhance their writing. In Mathematics, they have consolidated their understanding of halving collections, dividing by sharing and grouping, and working with addition and subtraction within 100. During free learning time, the children have shown creativity through Christmas craft activities and by writing thoughtful notes to our classroom elf, supporting both fine motor and written communication skills.



## Room 3



Wow! We can't believe the year has come to an end. We've had a busy couple of weeks. In Writing, we have been learning how to write a persuasive text, and our students worked in groups using modal verbs to write rules for different places. In Reading, we have been learning about the boxer crab, turtles, and the leafy sea dragon. In Mathematics, we have been learning about shape and number patterns, and students created their own pattern octopus. We have also been learning about fractions and even made fraction cupcakes to help students understand how parts make a whole. Some of our students have also been learning sign language, and they proudly signed and sang a Christmas song to our class it was a beautiful moment to watch. We participated in the Colour Fun Run, where the students enjoyed getting splashed with lots of colours. We finished the term off with the end of year concert our students did an amazing job participating, and they were very brave.
