#### **Attendance**

#### Did you know?

- In the early years of school, many concepts, such as literacy and numeracy, are taught in a sequence. This means that if your child is often away from school, it can make it difficult to catch up later.
- The Western Australian Telethon Kids Institute has found that the attendance habits set in Kindergarten and Pre-Primary are likely to continue throughout a child's school life, so it is important for them to go to school every day.
- The School Education Act 1999 requires all enrolled students to attend every day that their school is open.

If your child is absent from school, we ask that you contact the school and provide a reason for the absence so it can be accurately recorded on the attendance records.

Finally, I would like to wish all our families and staff a very safe holiday break and we look forward to seeing all our students return on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2023. Stay safe.

# Room 1










# WEST COAST FEVER CUP




## REPORTS

## How parents access reports in Connect

- Connect Now 2.0 app: To access the reports through the app on a phone or device, parents need to select the Connect icon in the top left corner of the screen, then 'My Children' tab and select 'Reports'.
- In a Browser. Parents can access the reports in the 'My Children' tab and select 'Reports'. They can select the year from the right-hand menu to access reports from previous semesters (if they have been published in Connect).

### Parent reminder: how to change between siblings when viewing reports

When parents select the 'My Children' tab, only one child's profile is visible. To access other children's profiles, parents can switch to view each child's profile and reports using the **switch button** in the top left corner of the screen. Here is a screenshot of the switch button.



# TRIPLE P PARENTING


With school holidays fast approaching, you may be looking forward to the change of pace and routine. Something we have to navigate as parents is the amount of screen time our kids have, especially during the winter holidays.

Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) highlight 6 traps to watch out for:

- 1. **The more screen time, the less physical activity.** This is part of what's feeding (pun intended) the growing obesity epidemic.
- 2. A decline in the ability to decode voice tone, facial expression and body language. Emerging research appears to show a connection between personal interactions based on texting, and becoming less skilled at face-to-face interaction.
- 3. **Fewer opportunities for positive, social family activities** where daily events can be discussed, social skills developed and relationships strengthened.
- 4. **Making it easier to bully and intimidate others**. Online communication seems to remove some of the limits imposed on saying certain things aloud, and face-to-face.
- 5. **Blurring of the line between reliable and unreliable information**. Given the vast amount of content being displayed 24/7, many adults, let alone children and teenagers, find themselves believing (and sharing) things like fake news items, health hoaxes, and opinions masquerading as facts.

**Later sleep onset and poorer sleep quality.** Exposure to screens prior to going to bed has been shown to disrupt our natural sleep rhythms (and during COVID-19, many families are finding that routines are hard enough to maintain without this added problem).
